

Owmby & Normanby Community Park

Strategic Plan 2022 - 2027

Introduction

A field, situated between Owmby and Normanby, was acquired by the two Parish Councils as part of a Section 106 Planning Agreement. This provided opportunity to develop a park with a variety of facilities to suit the aspirations of residents. The two Parish Councils will set up a joint Committee, comprising of 2 Parish Councillors from each Council plus two residents.

Vision

Create an exciting, attractive focal point to encourage participation and enhance the joint communities of the two villages

The achievement of this vision is subject to successful applications for grant funding and the continuing fundraising efforts of our joint communities.

Objectives

- 1. Create the facilities to host a variety of activities that will appeal to all ages of residents;
- 2. Involve residents at all stages of the build and maintenance of those facilities;
- 3. Create an attractive park that will physically join the two villages and form an effective hub;
- 4. Enhance the health and well-being of residents through the facilities/activities offered;
- 5. Alleviate loneliness by encouraging diverse activities suited to all residents;
- Ensure the facilities are designed in such a way that they may be, as far as practicable, accessible and relevant to all residents;
- 7. Promote equality.
